On Monday, March 16th, the City of San Francisco and 6 other counties in the Bay area ordered a new measure to reduce the spread of the novel coronavirus. People are asked to “shelter in place” by limiting their travel outside of their homes to essential travel only. **Essential travel includes:**

- shopping for necessary supplies
- accessing health care
- providing aid to family and friends who need assistance
- for non-residents, returning to their home outside the Bay Area.

Open Businesses: grocery stores, pharmacies, restaurants (for take-out or delivery only), and hardware stores.

Closed: virtually everything else.

Rainbow Market: Starting Thursday March 19th, Rainbow will have exclusive hours from 9am to 10am for adults 60+ or those who are part of vulnerable populations. They will have seniors line up along the orange line they have outside of the store. Safeway: From 7am to 9 am on Tuesdays and Thursdays, the company is reserving time for older adults and vulnerable populations. You can also shop at Safeway online:

- Delivery times vary and are taking longer than usual.

Target: Starting Wednesday, March 18th, Target will reserve the first hour of shopping for vulnerable guests, including adults 60+. Some stores open at 7am while others open at 8am, please check their website for the hours of your desired store. Also, Target offers other ways for you to shop:
