From Executive Director, Kate Hoepke:

Dear Members and Friends:

Membership in San Francisco Village has soared in the last two years. We're fast approaching 500 members, a good time to pause and celebrate our progress. It has taken more than a decade to get here, thanks to hundreds of people sharing a vision for connected community as we age. Many of those people operate behind the scenes, and I'd like to call a few of them forward.



Let's start with the Board of Directors. Twelve individuals who have committed their time and talent to ensure that SFV has the resources it needs to sustain itself. They're strategic thinkers, holding the vision for who we can become. They're advocates and ambassadors, connecting us to community partners that deepen our impact. They're problem solvers, idea generators, cheerleaders and critics. We couldn't function without them.

One board member in particular deserves our abiding appreciation. Bill Haskell has served on the Board of Directors for nine years, five of those years as Co-Chair. Because of term limits, Bill will complete his tenure this month. Sharing leadership with him all these years has been a gift. Bill is a light in my life. Thanks to his warm heart and tenacious spirit, we have manifested what he described several years ago as "an infrastructure of social care." His vision for the intersection of health care and social care helped to launch the Hospital Readmission Prevention Program in 2019 with Sutter Health and set us on course towards a larger mandate.

When we learned in 2016 that we had to vacate our office space at the Institute on Aging, Bill led the effort with Claudia Lewis, former Co-Chair, and Gretchen Addi, current Co-Chair, to find our new home on Fulton St. Bill stepped into the project management role, acting as liaison with the construction crew and guiding our team in the labyrinth of decisions to be made.

Reclaiming our Relationship with Death

We will all be called to bear witness to the dying process at some point, whether it be our own or of someone we love. However, our death-phobic culture does not

prepare us to support ourselves or loved ones in facing the inevitable end of life transition. This six-week interactive workshop is an invitation to explore your own relationship to death + dying through thoughtful inquiry and group discussions, and to learn practical tools for supporting a friend or loved one facing terminal illness or imminent death. Additionally, this workshop will:

- Offer practical information about the dying process
- Help clarify your own end of life values and wishes

Provide basic tools for navigating grief

Our sessions aim to hold space for deep discussions and opportunities for connection and dialogue. Blended with guided exercises and ceremony, this one-of-a-kind experience will create a spacious, welcoming, naturally occurring connected group vibe. Our hope is these connections extend beyond the 6 weeks. It is expected that participants attend at least five of the six sessions.

We will be guided by hospice nurse and death doula Stephanie Crawford. Her business, Awakened Endings, seeks to alleviate the fear and anxieties that accompany death and dying, and to help individuals awaken to the mystery and beauty of this very challenging time. Through thoughtful preparation, unbiased education, and helping you explore your unique end of life wishes, Awakened Endings is dedicated to helping you transition with dignity and ease.




